VII. FY'15 First Quarter Financial Report

Key Discussion Points

- Mr. Sapp presented the FY'15 First Quarter Financial Report.
- Total Operating Revenues are 3.8% below budget due to the higher than normal rainfall.
- Bond Issuance Costs are \$67,329 over budget because loans that were expected to close last fiscal year didn't close until current fiscal year.
- Thirty-five water EDUs and 57 sewer EDUs have been added since June 30, 2014.
- Unrestricted cash available for operations increased by \$44,885.
- Restricted cash in banks has decreased by \$1,073,501 due to revenue debt service associated with the Series 2012A revenue bonds.
- Restricted cash held by Beaufort County has decreased from \$598,720 to \$446,236 since June 2014. The reason for this decrease relates to GO debt service payment made first quarter.
- As of September 30, 2014, the District's financial condition is stable.
- Mr. Sapp and Mr. Geisler met yesterday to discuss the CAFR. The Finance Committee suggest holding a public hearing regarding a proposed rate increase of \$1 each to the water and sewer base rates.
- The consensus among the board was to hold a rate change public hearing at the December board meeting.
- Staff will advertise the hearing accordingly and forward a narrative on the proposed rate change to each commissioner.

Standard PPE and hygiene practices already in place at the PSD are the best defense as currently understood.
- The Town of Hilton Head held a public hearing on Nov. 13 to seek input on its 5-year Consolidated Plan. Mr. Nardi, Mr. Ford and Mr. Geisler attended and discussed the PSD's sewer extension effort as well as Project SAFE.
