





Hilton Head PSD & our Water Quality Supervisor earn statewide honors

Hilton Head Public Service District (PSD) earned the Facility of Excellence Award from the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), and its Water Quality Supervisor, Sarah Hickman, was recognized with the Crystal Crucible Award, and a statewide asset management workshop hosted by the PSD earned recognition. The awards were presented by the Water Environment Association of South Carolina (WEASC) at this month's South Carolina Environmental Conference.

DHEC's Facility of Excellence Award recognizes environmental protection and regulatory compliance at the PSD's Recycled Water Plant on Oak Park Drive. The plant annually recycles about 1 billion gallons of treated wastewater, producing beneficial recycled water that is then used for golf course irrigation and wetlands nourishment, with zero discharge to area waterways.

"The PSD's Recycled Water Plant plays a vital role in the sustainability of our delicate island environment," said PSD General Manager Pete Nardi. "The professionals at the PSD are ensuring that our interior wetland habitats continue to help wildlife and plant and tree species flourish, while also helping to preserve our water resources by providing our golf industry with high-quality recycled water for course irrigation."

April 14 is National Gardening Day!

Have you incorporated native plants into your garden yet?

Native plants thrive on their own: They require much less watering and less maintenance in general.

Why? Because they're adapted to your local soil and climate conditions.

Native plants also help the environment by providing

natural habitats in your lawn – helping birds, pollinators and other animals and insects thrive.

Get your irrigation system in check before the weather heats up!

Now that Spring is here, it's time to make sure your irrigation system is working properly before the weather really heats up!

You should follow these steps from our WaterSense Partner to complete a Sprinkler Spruce Up:

- 1. Inspect: Check your sprinkler system for leaks & breaks
- 2. Connect: Make sure all sprinklers, pipes and valves are properly connected
- 3. Direct: Your sprinkler system should be watering your lawn



and any plants you have in your landscaping — not the driveway, sidewalk, or road.

4. Select: If your irrigation system is out of date or just not up to current standards, select a WaterSense-labeled irrigation controller and water smarter!

*Please remember to also follow local town ordinance, which requires all irrigation systems to have a working rain gauge, and limits water use for irrigation to no more than twice per week. And once the weather really heats up, avoid watering during the heat of the day! Stick to early morning or evening for irrigation.

The tap water provided by Hilton Head PSD continues to meet or exceed all water quality standards set by the U.S. EPA and S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control. Make sure your irrigation system is efficient

Save water this Spring by following these quick water-saving tips:

Make sure your irrigation system is working efficiently (meaning it has no leaks, is directed only on plants and not sidewalks or driveways, has a working rain gauge, and you're only using it up to twice per week).
Save water used for rinsing produce to water any indoor plants
Only run full loads in the washing machine & dishwasher

□Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth

Take shorter showers (aim for 5 minutes!)
