

# Hilton Head PSD water system pipe inventory finds zero lead pipes

An extensive inventory of the Hilton Head Public Service District (PSD) water distribution system found no lead piping in the PSD water distribution system. The

inventory was conducted over the course of several years as part of a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) requirement. The PSD used extensive research and field observations to verify pipe materials. Decades-long, routine sampling of the water supplied by the PSD has found no lead in the tap water provided by the PSD. The inventory effort was led by PSD Water Quality Supervisor Sarah Hickman and PSD Project Manager Pete Schuelke, both of whom have been recognized by statewide water industry associations as outstanding water professionals.

"We are extremely pleased with the results of our water system pipe-material verification and inventory, and extremely proud of our entire team that worked diligently on completing this effort," said PSD General Manager Pete Nardi. "The quality and safety of our drinking water is the PSD's top priority, 24/7/365. Our lengthy track record of providing quality drinking water is a testament to the dedication and professionalism of the men and women who work on the complex systems that produce, treat, and monitor our drinking water. It also is the result of the ongoing support of our customers, our Board of Commissioners, and our island, which is our privilege to serve."





# Hilton Head PSD & BJWSA to conduct annual water main flushing program

Hilton Head Public Service District (PSD) and Beaufort-Jasper Water and Sewer Authority (BJWSA) will temporarily change the drinking water treatment method and flush water lines throughout their service areas for a two-week period starting Dec. 4. The change is part of the routine maintenance program for the utilities' water distribution systems. There will be no interruption in service related to this program.

Customers can use their water as normal but may notice a slight chlorine taste or smell in the tap water Dec. 4 - 18. Customers may also notice brief discoloration in the tap water as the result of lines being flushed. If water appears discolored, customers should run cold water for a few minutes. If discoloration persists for more than ten minutes, Hilton Head PSD customers can call (843) 681-5525.

Customers who are especially sensitive to the taste or smell of chlorine can keep an open container of drinking water in their refrigerator to allow the chlorine to dissipate. Water stored in refrigerated containers should be changed weekly.

# Reminder: Please don't flush prescription medications!



Old prescription medications, over-the-counter liquid, pills and even vitamins can unintentionally make their way to local waterways. Studies have found that medicines flushed down the drain become contaminates that can harm aquatic life and ultimately end up in our drinking water.

Help keep our local waterways clean by properly disposing of unused medications in one of Beaufort County's drop-off boxes.

Drop-off boxes can be found at Beaufort County Sheriff's Offices & the Bluffton Police Department. The drop-off boxes on Hilton Head and in Beaufort are open Monday through Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Bluffton location is open 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.You can also call to arrange a time after hours or on weekends.

### **Lowcountry Community Indicators**

The Lowcountry region—Beaufort, Colleton, Hampton, and Jasper Counties —experienced unprecedented growth, development, and change between 1990 and 2005. Between 2007 and 2010, a nationwide economic downturn negatively affected the region. Since 2011, the regional economy has shown signs of continuously rebounding. There is a great deal of quantitative information and data available that both confirms and explains what has taken place.

To continue monitoring and evaluating the state of the Lowcountry region, the Lowcountry Community Indicators (LCI) Project was initiated. The LCI consolidates the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry's <u>Community</u> <u>Indicators Report</u> and the Lowcountry Council of Governments' <u>the People</u> <u>and the Economy Report</u>. These two reports are complementary, providing common criteria and metrics related to the Lowcountry region.

The main objective of the LCI is to provide a centralized community resource offering relevant indicators that help support informed decisionmaking. The LCI will assist citizen leaders, public officials and policy makers, nonprofit organizations, businesses, researchers, and the media in making decisions to positively affect the community's well-being.

The LCI offers key indicators for the region that are understandable,

meaningful, and accessible through its

website <u>www.lowcountrycommunityindicators.org.</u> The website allows users to view, navigate to, and download specific, relevant indicators of each topic mentioned above. In addition, the user will have the ability to locate all the data for one specific county or compare the data for all four counties.
